## Our learning in Nursery

#### **Topic**

Our new topic is The Great Outdoors! We will be learning all about plants, minibeasts, seasons and hibernation. We started our topic with the theme of weather, reading The North Wind and The Sun. The children have been thinking about things change throughout the different seasons. We learned about condensation and evaporation; we will keep an eye on our weather bag to see if we can make rain in nursery. Next week we are learning about animals who hibernate and reading the story Goldilocks and The Three Bears. We have our exciting school trip and are hopeful to see some animals whom have come out of hibernation, but hopefully not a bear!

#### **Singing Hands and Makaton**

Each week as part of our timetable the children explore some Makaton and songs with sign. Communication comes in many forms!

We try to keep this based around the theme and have been learning the Makaton for a range of weathers.

## Our learning in Reception

#### **Topic**

This term is 'The Great Outdoors'. Through the term our selection of focus books will lead our discussion, learning and exploration. Very excitingly we have our own tadpoles in class, and we have been watching them grow. The children are confident in the life cycle of a tadpole through this experience.

#### **Maths**

At the start of the term we have focused on odd and even numbers. We are so proud of how well the children have processed this tricky concept! We have used numicon to identify which numbers have 'flat tops' which are the even numbers, and the 'hat tops' which are the odd numbers. These are a great way to visualise how odd numbers have an additional part. We used our prior knowledge of doubles and equal groups to develop our understanding of what an 'even' number is.

#### Literacy

Our first book this term is 'Tadpole's Promise' which is a wonderful love story between a tadpole and a caterpillar and follows the journey as they change into new animals! By having real tadpoles in class, the children have been particularly inspired and excited to challenge themselves to draw and write about tadpoles. As the term goes on we will be reading some beautiful books celebrating the great outdoors like Katie and the Sunflowers and Jack and the Jellybean Stalk.
