Our learning in Nursery

<u>Topic</u>

Our Spring 2 topic is 'Exploring Our World' we have driven our jeep to the farm and forest so far! The children read The Three Little Pigs and learned all about the other animals that live on a farm, we talked about healthy eating and the food produced on a farm. The big bad wolf was banished from the pig's house and made his way down to Grandma's cottage. We read Little Red Riding Hood and talked about being safe around people we don't know and listening to our parents when they give us instructions. Red wandered off the path, this was dangerous and got her and granny into trouble. The children learned about the other features of a forest, the different flora and fauna....

Next week we will be driving deep into the jungle, reading the story Giraffes Can't Dance!

Communication and Language

On top of all our other adventures this week, it has been Early Years Communication Week. The children had the opportunity to watch two live authors read and they taught us how to illustrate a story.

We joined the school in World Book Day, dressing up as heroes and villains, the children looked amazing and had such a lovely day.

We invited parents in and had so much involvement in our morning and afternoon, reading with your child is the best way to improve speech, communication and a love of learning.

<u>Topic</u>

Our topic 'Exploring the World' this term has started with a strong focus of looking after and caring for the oceans and animals in the sea. The children have had some brilliant discussions around why this is important to them, and made some beautiful art work to demonstrate this.

As part of our Forest School fire safety learning we made pancakes on the fire for Shrove Tuesday. The children loved this fantastic enriching experience.

<u>Maths</u>

At the start of the term we spent time reminding ourselves of our number bond to 5 and chanting and singing numbers to 20.

The children have recently been learning what 5 needs to make 6,7, and 8. The children used the STEM sentence "5 and _ make _". Through the rest of the term we will move onto subitising larger numbers by 'finding the 5' and then onto looking at doubles within 10 before Easter. Through our continuous provision, the children have constant access to maths learning to consolidate what we have done in class, and let them explore their own interests. Currently we are seeing how keen the children are to make their own numberblocks!

Literacy

In literacy we have been reading the stories 'If Sharks Disappeared' and 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley.' The books

Focus on the importance of saving our oceans through recycling and looking after our planet. The children have all enjoyed reading the stories and have written some wonderful independent sentences.

In phonics we continue to work on our sounds and read our phonics books. Please ensure that all phonics books come into school every day so we can change them when needed.
