Covid19

Earlier this week we shared with you information about a variant in the local area (Kingsbrook Estate) which is producing an increase in cases. Although all of Aylesbury received information from Buckinghamshire County, I also spoke directly with Public Health and the Health Protection Team to ensure that as a school we were doing anything we needed to. I was reassured, that it was believed, they have already contained the virus by isolating the initial people identified and their contacts. They also explained that the measures they are carrying out, of mass testing in Kingsbrook, is a precautionary to ensure that they have identified everyone. As a school we are being incredibly vigilant to ensure we keep our community as safe as possible. We do ask that if your child or a member of your household presents with any symptoms that you do isolate immediately and book a PCR Test just to be sure.

Masks in School—Although the Government Roadmap releases further restrictions from Monday, and schools are advised that they no longer are required to wear masks in classrooms, each school has to conduct its own risk assessment. Due to the local outbreak, we have taken the decision to continue to wear masks in classrooms for the next couple of weeks as an extra precautionary measure and will assess the risk again before half term.

If you or your child develop any of the symptoms it is vital that you book a PCR test and the whole family isolates immediately until they have received the results.

Although community LFD Tests are available and are useful for identifying anyone without any symptoms, it still remains essential that if you have any of the symptoms that it is a PCR test that you are required to take as LFD tests are not as accurate.

Please do not send your child to school if they have a temperature or cough. Book at PCR test and isolate immediately.


As a result, our new picnic bench is being delivered to school next week and is made entirely of recycled material. Well done everyone!

Coming Up Next Week

Next week, Key Stage 2 will experience their electricity workshops.

A huge thank you for the Griffin Trust for paying for this event.

Years 3+4—The interactive workshop enables pupils to explore static electricity, explore circuit boards, make some circuits to power buzzers, calculators and clocks and get some commercials circuit boards to work.

Years 5+6—The Eco-Electricity workshop has been designed to excite children about electricity and teach them about the eco-friendly ways of generating electricity. All of the children will make circuits to power items such as calculators, clocks, buzzers, radios and lights. They will also do an investigation about the best way of making electricity it power these circuits. To do this, pupils will generate electivity using 3 renewable energy sources including electricity generated windmills, solar panels and making electricity from potatoes or citrus fruits.

We hope the children will come out buzzing after their sessions. We will share some photos of this event with you next week.
