



This week has been R.E. and Diversity week so I thought this would be a good opportunity to share with you some books written by authors from a range of cultures and backgrounds.




Amy loves to make bao with her family. But it takes skill to make the bao taste and look delicious. And her bao keep coming out all wrong.


Then she has an idea that may give her a




But there is one thing Claire won't do ... The water in the swimming pool makes her feel squirmy inside. Follow her sisters? No thank you! Not today?

Thank you to everyone who donated money on Number Day. We have raised £177, which will go towards our new OPAL playground scheme.




### Teacher Challenges
